must provide a medical form. Parts A, B and C of the form are required, and must be signed by your scout's doctor.

Also needed is a copy of the front and back of your medical insurance card. These forms are good for one year, so if your son had his physical last July, he may still be current. These forms are due by June 1. Make your son's Physical appointment now!

ADULTS NEEDED

Adults will be needed to attend camp and help us to meet our requirement of having six parents on site at all times. All adults attending summer camp, must be registered, and have medical forms A, B, and C submitted. An email will be going out from Scoutlander with a link to a sign up page. As an adult, if you attend camp for less than 72 hours, your doctor does not need to sign your medical forms.

January Hodag Outing

The Hodag is a one day, one night (second night optional but encouraged) winter campout in which Scouts compete in Patrols/Crews/Dens in events variously emphasizing Scout skills, teamwork and spirit. It is 100% created and run by the youth of the Pon-Man Order of the Arrow chapter. Youth-led units compete to win The Coveted Golden Coffee Thingy.

Why call it a Hodag? The word "Hodag" comes from an alleged mythical beast (like the Loch Ness Monster or Big Foot or Paul Bunyan's Babe the Blue Ox) exhibited to the public in a large-scale prank in the 1890s in Rochester, Wisconsin. The prank ended when the Smithsonian Institution announced it would investigate the existence of the Hodag.

Our intrepid scouts attended this year's Hodag on January 29th and 30th. They competed in a ton of events which included a sled race! Great job guys!

Custaloga Town Scout Reservation



Custaloga Town Scout Reservation (CTSR) is located in north-east Pennsylvania near the city of Carlton. It is approximately 4 hrs and 55 mins from New Baltimore. The troop has been to this great Scout camp before and we are looking forward to going back!

When attending CTSR you will find a camping program that will meet the needs of every Boy Scout, Cub Scout, and Adult Scouter. Additionally, a wide variety of camping opportunities are offered throughout the year. In the Boy Scout Summer Camp Program a first year camper program (called Guyasutha's Braves) is offered, as well as

more challenging programs for the experienced Scout. These include canoeing, climbing and rappelling, biking, boating and much more.

Custaloga Town provides a shower facility, a fully equipped dining hall, a First Aid building staffed 24 hours a day by certified medical personnel, supervised boating and swimming, a field sports program with .22 rifle, archery, and shotgun ranges; a nature building, craft lodge, scout craft area, a climbing tower, the trading post, and much more. Custaloga Town Scout Reservation provides each unit with a campsite, which contains two-man tents on wooden platforms with bunks, picnic tables, bulletin board, flagpole, campfire area, washstand, and a latrine. All sites have a pavilion with picnic tables available. There are also modern facilities available for adults to use at their leisure.

Upcoming Campout in March

We will be heading out to D-Bar-A scout ranch on March 18th - 20th! It will be our first campout with the new scouts that have crossed over to our troop from Pack 82 and Pack 372! We will be staying in one of the cabins, and if there is overflow, the older scouts can "rough it" in one of our troop tents!!

The scouts will be organized into Patrols and will be working as a unit to cook their meals for the first time! They will also have a chance to visit the rifle range, and learn about, and earn, their Totin' Chip!

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What Happens to a Scout?

For every **<u>100</u>** boys who join Scouting, records indicate that:

- **Rarely** will one be brought before the juvenile court system
- 4 will become Eagle Scouts
- 17 will become future Scout volunteers
- 12 will have their first contact with a church

- 1 will enter the clergy
- 5 will earn their church award
- 18 will develop a hobby that will last through their adult life
- 8 will enter a vocation that was learned through the merit badge system
- 1 will use his Scouting skills to save his own life
- 1 will use his Scouting skills to save the life of another person

Scouts In Space

Of the 312 pilots and scientists selected as astronauts since 1959, at least 207 have been identified as having been Scouts or active in Scouting.

The list includes:

39 Eagle Scouts25 Life Scouts14 Star Scouts26 First Class17 Second Class Scouts13 Tenderfa10 Webelos Scouts25 Cub Scouts2 Wolf Scouts1 King's Scouts27 who were Girl Scouts3 ExplorersAnd 32 with unknown ranks

25 Life Scouts 26 First Class Scouts 13 Tenderfoot Scouts 25 Cub Scouts 1 King's Scout* 3 Explorers* nown ranks Of the 24 men to travel to the moon on the Apollo 9 through Apollo 17 missions, 21 were Scouts, including 10 of the 12 men who physically walked on the moon's surface, and all three members of the crew of Apollo 13. Three travelled to the Moon twice.

All three of the astronauts who died in the Apollo 1 fire, four of the seven who died in the Challenger launch explosion, and five of the seven who died in the Columbia re-entry explosion were Scouts.

Introducing a new merit badge for summer camp.




1. Take Morning and afternoon naps daily.

Philmont Scout Ranch Crew

Next year we will be sending a group of boys to the Philmont Scout Ranch in July 2016!! Philmont Scout Ranch, located near Cimmaron, NM, is the Boy Scouts of America's largest national High Adventure Base. It covers 137,000 acres - about 214 square miles - of rugged mountain wilderness in the Sangre de Cristo (Blood of Christ) range of the Rocky Mountains in northern New Mexico.

Philmont Scout Ranch operates 34 staffed camps and 55 trail camps. Philmont has high mountains with rough terrain and elevations that range from 6,500 to 12,441 feet! Our boys will be going for 12 days and will be attempting the 106 mile hike!! To participate, scouts must be 14 years of age OR completed 8th Grade and be at least 13 years of age prior to participation. So start your training today!!


Advancement Report
