Adults Need to Update Your Youth Protection Training



It is very important that all adults in the troop be aware that to accompany any scouts on a campout you <u>MUST</u> complete your Youth Protection training. This is to help keep our Scouts safer both in Scouting and in their daily lives. Effective with the upcoming re-charter period, Youth Protection Training (YPT) for leaders must be current throughout the entire 12 months of the charter period in order to reregister. This policy will require that all leaders renew their YPT bi-annually. The YPT certification is good for 2 years, but it is good practice to renew it annually.

In order for the troop to include you on our re-charter this fall, your training record must show that you have updated your training. Please retake the course this month. It only takes about 30 minutes of your time and will help the troop. You can logon to www.my.scouting.org and view your YPT certificate to verify that you are up-to-date or if you are close to renewal.

Youth Protection and Texting With Scouts

(from Scouting Magazine Sept-Oct 2016) Waiting on the Scout to email or call you back? You could be waiting a long time.


These days, three-fourths of teens have smartphones, and their favorite way to communicate is by texting, surveys show. But how does the Youth Protection rule prohibiting one-on-one contact apply to texting? First, let's review the official Youth Protection guideline on the matter:

"Two-deep leadership and no one-on-one contact between adults and youth members includes digital communication. Leaders may not have one-on-one private online communications or engage one on one in other digital activities (games, social media, etc.) with youth members. Leaders and Scouts should copy a parent and another leader in digital and online communication, ensuring no one-on-one contact exists in text, social media or other forms of online or digital communication."

Troop 211's policy of no one-on-one contact reflects the above. Mr. Thomas explained to the scouts at our September 28th meeting that if they need to contact a leader and they text, they should make it a group text and include their parent(s) and/or another leader.

The Troop believes that no scout should be excluded from activities because of financial considerations - this includes Summer Camp, High Adventure, Jamborees and monthly campouts!

We have a fund that can help with this issue. If you require further details, please contact Pat Morgan with requests or concerns.
